FSA Farm Programs That Rely on Drought Designations


- Livestock Forage Disaster Program (LFP)
 - Covers livestock producers that have suffered grazing losses due to drought.
 - Drought Monitor used to determine:
 - County eligibility
 - Payment rates.
- Emergency Livestock Assistance Program (ELAP)
 - Covers livestock producers that are hauling water to livestock due to drought
 - Drought Monitor used to determine county eligibility.


County Eligibility:

Drought Designation – Any Area of the County	During the Normal Grazing Period	Payment Equal to the Number of Monthly Payments*
D2 – Severe Drought	8 consecutive weeks	1
D3 – Extreme Drought	Any time	3
D3 – Extreme Drought	At least 4 weeks - Can be nonconsecutive	4
D4 – Exceptional Drought	Any time	4
D4 – Exceptional Drought	At least 4 weeks - Can be nonconsecutive	5





Eligible Producer

Has livestock that normally grazed eligible pastureland or grazing land:



Has eligible pastureland or grazing land, owned or leased, physically located in a county approved for LFP:

- Native Pasture/Rangeland
- Improved Pasture
- Small Grain
- Annual ryegrass
- Forage Sorghum

LPF Payments

- LFP payments are 60% of the lesser of the following multiplied by the number of monthly payments based on drought designation:
 - Livestock monthly feed cost based on the number and type of livestock
 - Pasture monthly feed cost base on pasture type and carrying capacity.

ELAP – Water Hauling

- Any part of the County must be designated D3, extreme drought during the normal grazing period.
- Payment based on 60%* of the lesser of:
 - The calculated cost to transport water to eligible livestock for 150 days:
 - Number of eligible livestock (converted to animal units)
 - Daily water requirement per animal unit (12-18 gallons per animal unit)
 - National average price/gallon (3.5 7 cents per gallon)
 - Maximum of 150 days.
 - The calculated cost to transport water to eligible livestock based on:
 - Actual number of gallons of water transported
 - National average price/gallon (3.5 7 cents per gallon).

*90% if beginning, socially disadvantaged, or veteran farmer or rancher,

FSA FARM LOAN PROGRAMS

DISASTER DESIGNATIONS AND EMERGENCY LOANS

Types of Emergency Designations

- Presidential Requested by Governors through the FEMA regional office
- Secretarial Can be requested by local government officials, State Governors, State Agriculture Commissioners, State Secretary of Ag, Indian Tribal Council, other State government officials, or individual farmers
- APLN Requested by the FSA State Executive Director from the Administrator
- Quarantine Requested by the FSA State Executive Director and approved by the Secretary

Process for Fast Track - Drought

- FSA State Office Receives notification of disaster designation
- Notification will list the primary county/ies and the contiguous counties
- Prepares Disaster Notice and distributes to FSA County Offices
- Allows producers in the primary and contiguous counties to submit application for FSA FLP Emergency Loan for a period of 8 months from the time of the designation
- To be a designated loss, the producer must have at least a 30% loss due to the disaster designation in one crop
- Once the 30% loss is established, then all loss will be eligible.
- Maximum loan amount will be the amount of loss up to \$500,000.

APLN DESIGNATIONS

- PHYSICAL LOSSES INCURRED AS A RESULT OF A NATURAL DISASTER. NATURAL DISASTERS ARE DISASTERS IN WHICH UNUSUAL AND ADVERSE WEATHER CONDITIONS OR OTHER NATURAL OCCURRENCES HAVE SUBSTANTIALLY AFFECTED FARMERS BY CAUSING A SEVER PHYSICAL LOSS:
 - SUCH AS DROUGHT, FLOODING, HIGH WINDS, ETC.
- INCLUDES DESTRUCTION OF BUILIDNGS, FARMING EQUIPMENT AND DEATH OF LIVESTOCK

PRODUCERS MAY APPLY FOR FSA EMERGENCY LOANS WITHIN 8 MONTHS OF THE DISASTER DESIGNATION

- FSA STATE OFFICE ISSUES NOTICE TO COUNTY OFFICES
- NATONAL OFFICE REVIEWS AND ISSUES DESIGNATION

SED SENDS A SIGNED REQUEST TO THE FSA ADMINISTRATOR

- COUNTY EMERGENCY BOARD CONCURS
- CED COMPLETES INFORMATION IN STORM SYSTEM



FSA FLP EMERGENCY LOANS

- PRODUCTION LOSS VERIFIABLE DAMAGE OR DESTRUCTION WITH RESPECT TO ANNUAL GROWING CROPS EXCLUDES LIVESTOCK (ANIMALS)
 - PRODUCTION LOSS INCLUDES QUALITY LOSS COMPARING AVG MARKET PRICE AT THE GRADE NORMALLY SELL THE PROUDCT WITH AVG PRICE OF GRADE AT SALE
 - LOSSES TO NATIVE PASTURE/RANGELAND AVG PER HEAD FEED PURCHASED 3 YRS PRIOR TO DISASTER COMPARED TO AVG IN DISASTER YEAR. MUST MEET 30% RULE
- PHYSICAL LOSS VERIFIABLE DAMAGE OR DESTRUCTION WITH RESPECT TO REAL ESTATE OR CHATTEL, EXCLUDING ANNUAL GROWING CROPS
- TWO TYPES:
 - CHATTEL
 - BASIC SECURITY
 - NORMAL INCOME SECURITY
 - REAL ESTATE

CHATTEL PHYSICAL LOSS

TWO TYPES

- BASIC SECURITY WHICH CONSIST OF EQUIPMENT, PERENNIAL CROPS, FRUIT AND NUT BEARING TREES, AND FOUNDATION LIVESTOCK INCLUDING REPLACEMENTS
- NORMAL INCOME SECURITY, WHICH INCLUDES LIVESTOCK NORMALLY SOLD EVERY YEAR, LIVESTOCK PRODUCTS, NURSERY STOCK, AND HARVESTED AND STORED CROPS THAT WOULD BE SOLD OR FED DURING THE NORMAL OPERATING CYCLE.
